
Communicating with the school



Primary and Post Primary Admissions



Key Messages for Parents

- The 'Apply Now' link for Post Primary applications will be live on the EA website from **Tuesday 30 January at 12 noon**. Applications will close on **Thursday 22 February 2024 at 12 noon**.
- Applications **are not** considered on a first come, first served basis.
- It is important to **submit** your applications by **12 noon** on 22 February 2024 as an application received after this time will be treated as 'late' by the school and this may affect the chance of being offered a place in the school.
- It is recommended that parents use a supported internet browser e.g. Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge, Safari etc. The application **will not** work on Internet Explorer.
- It is the responsibility of parents to check that all relevant information is included on their child's application before submitting it.
- A number of resources are available online including tutorial videos, FAQs and quick reference guides, in multiple languages, to support parents with the Post Primary application process via **EA Connect**.
- Parents can check if their child would be **eligible for transport** assistance to school on the EA website - [Check Transport Eligibility](#)
- Parents have the right to express school preferences, but no child can be guaranteed a place at any particular school. More than half of Post Primary schools are oversubscribed and not all children who apply will receive a place at an oversubscribed school. To ensure a child has the best chance of being offered a Post Primary school place of their choice, it is strongly recommended that **at least four schools** are listed in the order of preference and include at least one non-grammar school. Up to 12 schools can be listed on the online application and if more are needed these may be emailed to EA.
- It is important that parents **read the admissions criteria** of the schools they are considering. This will help them to assess if their child is likely to be offered a place.

The criteria inform how the school will decide which children will be selected if the school is oversubscribed. Parents should think about how well their child meets the criteria which can be found on the EA website. If parents have queries on a school's criteria they must contact the school for clarification.

Information on the number of applications the school received in previous years and the number of pupils who were accepted are included in the school's criteria to let parents know if the school is usually oversubscribed.

This week we also completed the NSPCC workshop 'Speak out Stay Safe Programme' with the pupils where they learned how to speak up when in need of help or if worried.

Speak out Stay safe is a safeguarding programme for children aged 5- to 11-years-old. It is available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It helps children understand:

- *abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse*
- *that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be safe where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including our Childline service.*

The programme content links directly the curriculum and helps reinforce key messages about abuse and neglect.

Transfer Class began this week in P6 and will continue on Thursdays from 3-4pm with Mr Thompson.

Cricket continued this week for P4&5 with Harry Lockhart.

Aoife Cunningham from EA Reach Programme returned this week to work with the P6 children on friendships and resilience and to work on transition with P7's. This programme will last for 4 weeks.

On Monday the P5-7 children enjoyed a fabulous trip to the Palace Stables in Armagh where they learned all about the sport of Orienteering.


